

MECONOPSIS GROUP SEED EXCHANGE - Autumn 2022

Welcome to the 2022 seed exchange. Please read these instructions carefully

New instructions for EU members – All seed entering the EU from the UK must be accompanied by phytosanitary certificates which will be paid for by the Meconopsis Group. To retain a reasonable seed exchange, EU members are requested to select only Meconopsis items, **not companion plants**. EU members must submit their desiderata by **14th November**, to allow sufficient time for all seed destined for the EU to be inspected and given phytosanitary certification. Hopefully this will be a temporary measure until a 'Small Lots' scheme has been put in place.

Other members - Indicate your desiderata of 10 packets by placing 'X' in the box plus 5 alternatives 'A'. **If you do not provide alternatives it will be assumed that none are required.** Seed of *M. punicea* can be requested in advance for August 2023 (assuming that it will be available), as part of the current 10 packet consignment. Seed donors will be given priority until **10th November**. All requests must arrive by **28th November**, when the seed exchange will close. Please e-mail me if your seed request has not arrived within a reasonable length of time.

Extra packets of seed, at 50p per packet, may be requested from any stock remaining after the main seed exchange has closed by placing an 'E' in the box. Use 'AE', so that extra seed will be sent if it has not been used as an alternative in the initial allocation. Members requesting extra packets will have their initial allocation made up and kept aside until the seed exchange closes, whereupon the extra seed will be added to their initial allocation.

There is no charge for your initial allocation of 10 packets – this applies to both UK and non-UK members. Members requesting extra seed will be invoiced by e-mail after 1st December. Please do not try to pay in advance, as extra seed may not be available. A list of remaining seed will be sent out prior to closure.

Payment for extra seed can be made using the PayPal button, which has a variable value payment facility, on the Seed Exchange web-page: <https://themeconopsisgroup.org/requesting-seed>

Please remember to complete the return address label. There is **no need** to send a self-addressed envelope.

US members must have a 'Small Lots of Seeds' permit, issued by APHIS. You can find details of how to get a permit at: http://www.aphis.usda.gov/import_export/plants/plant_imports/smalllots_seed.shtml

The 'Small Lots' permit is the only one not requiring phytosanitary certification in the UK. Together with your seed request, we need a copy of your permit with the conditions attached to it, and a green and yellow customs quarantine label. You can make your seed selection online, but no seed will be dispatched until we have your permit documents and customs label. We understand that the permit lasts for 3 years and can be re-used.

Research seed from named cultivars should only to be used for research and hybridising purposes. For further information on the sources of the MGS#100 series seed, contact the seed exchange manager.
